Dr. Megan Weiss

Dr. Megan Weiss spent two years researching the history of Daughters of Utah Pioneers at the Pioneer Memorial Museum as a PhD Candidate in US History at the University of Utah. She read the minutes of National and International Board Meetings from the beginning of the Society in 1901 through 2001. Her dissertation, now completed, gives the first book-length, scholarly history of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers. Megan has recently graduated from the University, and we are proud to note that a portion of her work was published in the *Utah Historical Quarterly* in the Winter of 2026 volume entitled “A History of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers.”

Megan has worked for the Utah Historical Society, served a fellowship at Utah Humanities, hosted a weekly radio show called *Beehive Archive*, and is now employed on the Women's History Initiative Team for UHS. An engaging and motivational speaker, we are proud to host her as our speaker for the ISDUP Convention.
